PALNI libraries serve 41,424 students across the state


Through shared technology, services, and staff, PALNI institutions achieve greater scale, efficiency, and outcomes in **student success** than any single library could accomplish alone.



\$398,000 in grant support received from IMLS

In 2024. The Institute of Museum and Library Services granted \$149,893 to support the PEARL open source reading list tool, and \$248,600 to PALNI and PALCI to enhance and sustain Hyku.



Cost-saving solutions through partnerships

PALNI actively participates in external partnerships that increase the visibility of our institutions and help our libraries achieve initiatives more effectively in terms of quality and cost savings.



\$2.8 million

saved via PALSave

PALNI's Lilly Endowment-funded affordable learning program. Other highlights: 46,180 students impacted; 899 faculty reached; 369 courses transformed; 100% of PALNI schools involved; \$61.58 (avg.) saved/student.



Up to \$20,000

In 2024, PALNI awarded an \$8,000
Library Innovation Grant to Saint Mary's
College for "You Belong in the Library,"
and a \$4,405 Innovation Research Grant
to support the project, "Information Literacy
Assessment of Religious Leaders."
